

My dog is 8 weeks old. Her name is Cupcake. She is kind of like a bulldog. She is black and brown.


She likes to eat Scooby snacks and bacon.

Family of animals that are small mammals like mice and squirrels


Whiskers

Long hairs near a cat's mouth that helps it feel




